What is VET in Schools (VETis)?

Vocational Education and Training (VET) provides secondary school students an opportunity to gain a nationally recognised qualification that contributes to VCE or VCAL. These programs are delivered by trainers with expert knowledge in the field and increase the employability skills of students.

Entry Requirements

Students choosing to enrol in a VETis program must be:

- at least 15 years of age at course commencement,
- able to meet LLN requirements, and
- currently enrolled in Year 10, 11 or 12.

Course Costs

Cire Services will charge your school directly for tuition and material fees. Your school may decide to pass on a portion of this cost to students (usually material fees if attending a Government school).

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Course Withdrawal

Students have up to four weeks from the commencement date to withdraw from the course.

Withdrawals after the 4-week census date will incur full fees.

Education Support

In accordance with the Disability Standards for Education 2005, Cire Training provides “reasonable adjustments” to accommodate students with disabilities and will consult with students and their families / carers to understand what kind of assistance is needed.

Additionally, Cire Training provides smaller class sizes and flexible learning options to cater to students with additional needs. Support staff are also available upon request and Cire Training will work closely with the student’s secondary school to ensure that their learning experience is a positive and fulfilling one.

Structured Workplace Learning

Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) is designed to help students apply the skills and knowledge they learn in their VET program in an industry environment.

Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) experiences help students relate theory to a real world work environment while developing their skills.

SWL is a valuable component of all VET qualifications, and where possible should be spread across the duration of the VET program.

It provides context for:

- enhancement of skills development
- practical application of industry knowledge
- assessment of units of competency/modules, as determined by the Registered Training organisation
- increased employment opportunities.

VCE VET program publications contain information relating to the SWL requirements. In all cases, SWL is strongly recommended. Several VCE VETis programs have a mandated SWL component.

The SWL requirements are expressed in hours and weeks, and are expected to be carried out over the duration of VCE VET programs.

Course Description

This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of early childhood education settings who work within the requirements of the Education and Care Services National Regulations and the National Quality Standard.

Support the implementation of an approved learning framework, and support children's wellbeing, learning and development. Depending on the setting, educators may work under direct supervision or autonomously.

In this course you will undertake the following:

1. practical activities
2. research and Projects
3. written activities/Multiple choice questions
4. oral presentations/Verbal questioning
5. group work/working as a team.

Entry Requirements

Students will be accepted into this course if they are attending secondary school at Year 11 or above.

They also complete the pre-course review including the LLN Tool and achieve the Australian Core Skills Level of 3. At this level, students may either work alongside an expert/mentor where prompting and advice can be provided or may work with an expert/mentor where support is available if requested.

Structured Workplace Learning

Cire Training requires all our VETiS students to undertake a minimum of 80 hours of structured workplace learning (SWL) spread across the two years of the program, this being 40 hours annually. If you undertake 80 hours of SWL and the workplace learning record in one year you can provide one general credit for VCAL.

Pathways from the Qualification

The course is a partial completion, once you have completed your two year VETiS program, you can apply to complete the remaining units to be able to graduate from the CHC30113 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care.

Course Description

This course incorporates learnings from the CHC22015 Certificate II in Community Services and offers students the opportunity to learn about the community services sector and explore specific contexts of work. Skills will be developed in communication, working with diversity, workplace health and safety, administration support, and responding to clients.

Entry Requirements

Students will be accepted into this course if they are attending secondary school at Year 10 or above.

They also complete the pre-course review including the LLN Tool and achieve the Australian Core Skills Level of 3. At this level, students may either work alongside an expert/mentor where prompting and advice can be provided or may work with an expert/mentor where support is available if requested.

Structured Workplace Learning

Cire Training requires all our VETiS students to undertake a minimum of 40 hours of structured workplace learning (SWL) per year.

This totals to 80 hours over the whole program (2 years).


